
#### Christian Education Continued

#### Finance Ministry: Chairman Tim Lea & Vice Chair Shannon Bullard

New joy comes with the New Year. The new joy for Culdee is the addition of the 2001 Yamaha Disklavier Grand Piano that is now in the Sanctuary. This piano means so much to so many and will hopefully provide years and years of beautiful music along with providing musical functions that have not been available before. With this being a used piano, cost was less than expected leaving roughly \$10,000.00 in the designated fund that can now be used for expenses related to the piano. Congratulations to all who helped this addition come to fruition.

At the request of the Women of the Church, the Finance Ministry approved recommending to the Session the establishment of a designated fund for the professional redesign and renovation of the Fellowship Hall kitchen. Culdee family and friends have all enjoyed a meal or two from this wonderful little kitchen. This project is an excellent way to make sure Culdee enjoys more meals for years to come in a more efficient kitchen.

At the urging of Pastor Connie, the policies regarding the usage of Culdee's facilities were reviewed for necessary updates by an ad hoc committee. Upon the initial review of the update by the Finance Ministry, the recommendation to the ad hoc committee was a statement regarding liability needed to be included. With this addition the Finance Ministry voted to recommend to the Session the approval of the updated facilities usage policies including any donations collected be contributed to the Building and Grounds Ministry's designated fund for continued maintenance.

The Session approved expenses resulting in Culdee ending 2023 over budget by roughly \$22,000.00. This overage included the additional eight hours per week for the office manager's position with the accompanying expenses; the replacement of the water heater bladder and the addition of a portable generator along with the necessary electrical wiring at the manse; a sign intended to be placed on NC Hwy 73, additional locks and doors to better secure access to the church, and upgrades to the audio visual system in the sanctuary.

Thank you for your continued support. New and exciting opportunities are on the horizon for Culdee in 2024.




