When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. (Acts 2:1-4, NRSV)

On Sunday, May 19<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate Pentecost at Culdee Church. This is the Sunday each year that we remember the coming of God's Holy Spirit upon believers in Jerusalem, following the death and resurrection and ascension of Jesus. Christians refer to this event as "the birthday of the Church." Even though the gospel writer John tells us that Jesus had already breathed the Holy Spirit on his disciples to empower them for their work as apostles (John 20:21-23), God's Spirit showed up in a mighty way at the Jewish celebration of Pentecost (Shavuot). You can read the whole story in Acts, chapter 2.

Since I preached from Acts 2 last year, we'll hear the Pentecost story read on May 19th; then my message will be from Ezekiel 37, the story of his vision of the valley of dry bones. There are two things I invite you to do for May 19<sup>th</sup>. One is to wear "the colors of flame;" red, yellow, orange, or some combination thereof, so that our sanctuary might be alight with the colors of Pentecost. The other is to come having read and pondered the first two chapters of the Book of Acts, and what the message may be for the work and witness of Culdee Presbyterian Church.




There are a lot of things that I never thought about before working at a school. One of the needs that I discovered when I first started as a School Social Worker was that lots of students had accidents, spilled something on their shirt or pants, their water bottle leaked so they needed a new backpack, etc. Some students ask for socks and snacks, too. In the past, schools I have worked at from alternative, elementary, and high have

had donations of clothes somewhere at the school. In one school there was nowhere to store the clothes other than backstage in the auditorium. In another, they were in a room in the gym, and at another, clothes were stored in unused lockers. At my current school, Pinecrest, they were upstairs on the balcony of the library. At all the schools, I would go with the student in need to the donation location and we would go through so many piles and stacks of clothes often to have no luck finding something that would fit. When we did find things we thought would work, students would spend time trying on clothes often to find that nothing fit. Students would then have to call home and if parents had transportation, they would have to leave their jobs, go home to get clothes, and bring them to the student or just pick the student up and take them home. This was not working! Students were missing valuable time in class.

When discussing options for service projects with the youth, they decided the emergency clothes closet at Pinecrest was what they wanted to help with. The new closet is stocked with black leggings, jogging pants, underwear, and a flushable wipe in a labeled by size ziplock bag. Plain T-shirts labeled by size, socks, jackets or hoodies, belts, and bookbags are also available. This allows a quick, five-minute turnaround and students are able to get back to class much sooner than before and feeling less embarrassed. The youth are taking inventory monthly to see what we need to reorder. At the rate that the closet is getting used, we are serving approximately 12 students per week with clothing needs and we have students asking for snacks on a daily basis.

After last week, we are completely out of leggings of all sizes and need to restock the closet! If you would like to help, you can give monetary donations to the church office or choose an envelope of the amount you wish to give from the bulletin board in the sunroom and put the envelope on the collection plate on Sunday. All of the money raised will go to Pinecrest High School Emergency Clothes Closet! Thank you!

In other youth news, we are all busy with Spring activities including travel basketball, lacrosse, horseback riding, and scouts. Our youth are quite amazing in how they are able to juggle school, church, home, sports, and community. I could not be prouder of them!! Celeste Marino

It's hard to believe that in 6 months, on October 19, 2024, Culdee's annual Harvest Festival, Auction and Chicken and Dumplings dinner will be here. Please start considering where you feel led to help. Seeing that it's spring-cleaning time, and you're looking to declutter, consider donating items that can be used for both the auction and yard sale.

The parking lot trees and shrubbery will be planted during the Fall. There are several things that must be done to prepare the beds to accept the new trees and shrubbery to make sure that they have continuous care so we can enjoy them for many years to come.

Sandhills Accounting Services will be conducting our annual financial review for 2023 after the tax season is complete.

Every three years, Culdee must go through an insurance bid process. Several insurance companies are currently submitting their proposals and one will be chosen very soon that best fits the needs of Culdee Presbyterian Church.

As of March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, the year-to-date dividends, interest and realized gains on investments is \$1,731.45. Year to date unrealized gains is \$15,861.12. This creates a total year to date realized and unrealized gain of \$17,592.57.

One wide-tooth comb removed from the package. It must be sturdy with at least 6" of teeth. No pocket combs or picks.


One fingernail or toenail clipper (Either one is acceptable. Remove from packaging.)


One bath-size bar of soap in the original package
