

This Tuesday morning group with no name thrives on making music and searches for opportunities to share it with others. Our hope is that the music we play will bring as much joy to others as it does to us.




We play a wide variety of music – folk, county, bluegrass, and gospel. Most of the songs were popular before 1980 since that is when most of us were seriously listening to music.



The willow oaks, helleri holly, centipede sod, and pine bark mulch look great and will be enjoyed for many years to come.







Every three years, your Finance Ministry receives quotes from several different insurance companies to make sure that we have the best insurance with the best rate. This was completed last year, and our annual renewal has been processed with North Carolina Farm Bureau.

Moore County Tax Department sent out the AV10 Property Tax Audit. These forms are required to be filled out for each property the church owns to make sure that the property is still eligible for tax exemption. The forms were received by the Moore County Tax Office and the properties will still maintain the tax exemption.

On your April Finance Report, the Stifel Nicolaus Investments are showing a total year to date realized and unrealized loss of \$1,248.21. Please know that your Finance Ministry watches this and understands that this has been a rough start to the year and the best course of action is to stick with the current investments.

The annual Harvest Festival is quickly approaching. Your Finance Ministry oversees the auction and yard sale. We need your help with gathering items for both the auction and yard sale.
