

press the help button and a Trained Care Specialist will make sure you get the help you need. Lifeline now offers a GPS type unit necklace device that allows you to summon help whenever you are away from your home, as long as there is cell coverage in the area.


COMMUNITY FUN DAY WITH EASTER EGG HUNT




Session 2025 Member



Chancel Choir, in their new robes, getting ready for Easter services.






