Matthew 5:16 Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven.



The week's Bible study focused on prayer, and as the week progressed our Culdee campers were willing to pray. The overnight experience included swimming, archery, crafts, and banana Olympics. The faces of each one there completed the story. Eyes were filled with excitement, and although they were tired, they hesitated to leave each other and wanted to gather again. We are thankful to the families for trusting us with their children and to the Culdee family for allowing us this opportunity!





The PNC has met weekly since March 10, 2020 and so far, has reviewed over 100 Pastor Information Forms since August 17, 2020. The PNC has communicated or interviewed with several potential candidates, trusting that God will guide discernment during this process. Culdee's PNC is working diligently and with faith that God will put the pastor He wants in the PNC's path at the right time. Please continue to have patience and pray for the discernment of the PNC and the pastor candidates so that God's will is done.

## PASTOR WELCOME BOOK

In preparation for a new pastor and to assist the new pastor in learning Culdee's church family, the Session has given approval for the creation of a *Culdee Family Welcome Book* sponsored by the PNC. Nancy Howle, Janie Taylor and Stephanie Barber of Culdee's PNC are heading up this project and will be asking for your assistance. Soon Nancy Howle will begin taking photographs of the church family attending services. There will also be a basic information sheet to be completed with space to share any additional information or notes that will help the pastor learn the congregation. Photographs will be attached to the information sheets, then the sheets will be compiled and the *Culdee Family Welcome Book* will be ready for the arrival of a new pastor. Church members are welcome to attend monthly Finance Ministry & Session meetings, usually the second Sunday, beginning at 4:30.


### **Financial Status:**


Thank you for your continued support of Culdee. The attached Sandhills Accounting Services (SAS) June 2021 Financial Report remains positive. Currently there are 10.89 months of reserve funds available, 6 months of which are for emergencies. Please understand that reserve funds continue to grow because Culdee is not currently paying a pastor's salary. Additionally, the SAS June 2021 report indicates that if Culdee had a pastor right now and was fully operational, contributions total \$185.88 year to date above the budget.

Interest earned on accounts at Culdee's banks, BB&T and Live Oak, compared to the earnings of funds invested with Stifel Wealth Management Group shows that BB&T & Live Oak's \$186.456.31 earned a total of \$733.50 in interest while Stifel's \$249,564.33 grew by \$14,621.21 for the same time period. There is the realization that the market fluctuates, as will investment and earnings. Funds are invested for moderately conservative growth, as was recommended for churches and non-profits by the professionals at Stifel.
