# Actions from the Stated Session meeting of May 16, 2021 June Stewart, Clerk of Session

The meeting was held at 6:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall with Rev. Rick Martindale as Moderator and a quorum of Elders in attendance.

- Approved: Beverly Dunlop will resume meeting with "Joyful Noise" in September on Mondays in the Fellowship Hall from 2 4 p.m.
- Approved: A paid membership for Beverly Dunlop in The Presbyterian Association of Musicians (PAM).
- Approved: Those attending worship services in the sanctuary are to mask as comfortable or as
  vaccinated; those who are not completely vaccinated are encouraged to continue using masks. Everyone
  is encouraged to social distance according to their comfort level.
- Approved: The group going to the Camp Monroe Work Day on Saturday, May 22 will use the van.
- Approved: The Session recommended that the Pastor Nominating Committee move forward with the six current members.
- Approved: A congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, June 6 with Presbytery Liaison, Oscar
   Pace as Moderator.
- Approved: To help the transition when Culdee has approved a new pastor, the PNC will ask the
  congregation to help them create a booklet containing pictures and brief profiles of individuals and
  families in church.
- Approved: The three recipients of 2021 Doris Moore Scholarships will each receive \$500.00.

Culdee Graduates and Doris Moore Memorial Scholarship recipients will be recognized during our Church service on Sunday, June 20, 2021.


#### **BUILDING AND GROUNDS – Tim Bailey Chair**

1954. It has a covenant partnership in ministry with the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina. # Finance Ministry: Chairman Danny Aldridge & Vice Chair Diann Fortune

#### **Meeting Schedule:**

The Finance Ministry meets in the Session Room at 4:30 following its regular schedule of the second Sunday of the month. The Session meeting follows at 6:00 in the Fellowship Hall. Church members are welcome to attend. Any changes to meeting times will be listed in the bulletin.

#### **Financial Status:**

The attached Sandhills Accounting Services April 2021 Financial Report shows that the church is holding steady financially. Thank you all for making this possible. Currently there are 9.96 months of reserve funds available, 6 months of which are for emergencies. Please understand that reserve funds continue to grow because Culdee is not paying a pastor's salary.

Of interest was the significant difference between the interest earned on accounts at Culdee's banks, BB&T and Live Oak, compared to the earnings of funds invested with Eastman, Palmer, Davis and Vaughan-Stifel. The included financial analysis shows that BB&T & Live Oak's \$193,795.90, earned a total of \$618.42 in interest while Stifel's \$214,986.17 grew by \$8,906.83 for the same time period.

### **Lightning Strike & Insurance Update:**

Progress continues to be made regarding the damage from the September 2020 lightning strike. The damaged CD Recorder has been replaced. This concludes the repairs to the sound system.

#### Copier:

The new copier has been installed in the church office and seems to be working just fine.


#### Manse Renovation and Repairs:

The following action approved by the Session in April was reported to the Finance Ministry.

Building and Grounds will continue the interior renovation and repairs including:

- 1. Restoring exhaust vent to the master bathroom.
- 2. Replace the ¼" thick board portion of the ceiling above the shower in master bath.
- 3. Assess and repair the mold still on the remaining wall near the basement fireplace.
- 4. Replace sheetrock and trim and paint the bedroom in the basement.
- 5. Add a toilet to the partial bath in the basement making it a full bath.

Once completed, the manse will be ready for occupation by a pastor.
