West Community Presbytery Meeting

Zoom Meeting, Saturday, February 12, 2022

I was fortunate as a brand new Elder to be asked to "attend" the West Community Presbytery meeting held by Zoom Call on Saturday, February 12. There were 63 attendees. Rev. Laura Lupton organized the meeting. Rev John Taylor of Jonesboro Pres. was facilitator. During worship time, Rev. David and Susan Hudson shared their desire to return to Japan as missionaries. At the present time, there are no missionaries in Japan. Their plan is to work with staff at Yodogama Christian Hospital in Osaka. This hospital was built in 1955 utilizing the Presbyterian Women's birthday Objective monies from that year at a cost of \$208, 000. The hospital focuses on whole person care and healing.

Meeting Highlights:

West Steering Committee: Funding is available for Youth Scholarships to Presbyterian Youth Triennium. Thirty Confirmants attended the Confirmation Event. Presbyterian Night at the Woodpeckers Ballgame Is set for Friday, August 26 versus the Charleston Riverdogs. More details to come!

Elders Pathways Program: Ruling Elders are needed to start Pathways program through Union Presbyterian Seminary (on-line). These folks would be able to serve a church in the absence of a minister full-time.

Financial Status:

December 2021 data from Sandhills Accounting Services shows that Culdee finished the year blessed in that all expenses were paid through contributions. Thank you for your support!

In looking at the budget from the perspective of Culdee being fully operational and with a pastor, December's numbers improved the deficit from November's \$11,446.39 to a lesser \$7,995.90. Again, thank you! Culdee's Session will continue to be frugal and resourceful while doing God's work and meeting needs going into this new year.

Investments finished strongly for 2021 even with all the fluctuation and changes occurring in the world. God connects people when the time is right and by all indications the connection between Culdee and Stifel was right. Growth will allow Culdee to do more with money given for God's glory.

in this and we need to step out in faith." This being our first New Year's meal event some of us did have our reservations. How would the community respond to our event, would we be able to solicit the necessary church participation, what if there was another Covid outbreak, etc?

Although our sign up board contained many unfilled requests, our planning continued and with prayer the decision was made for the proceeds of the event to be donated to the tornado victims in Kentucky. We faithfully prayed and asked for God's blessing. There were 33 collards, 22 pounds of black eyed peas and 22 Boston butts


